Q: What courses are offered at Thika TTI?

A: Electrical Engineering, ICT, Business, Hospitality, Applied Sciences, Health Sciences, Building & Civil Engineering, , Automotive Engineering Mechanical Engineering ,at Level 4,5 and 6.

Q: What are the minimum entry requirements?

A: Level 6: KCSE C- and above; Level 5: KCSE D+ and above; Level 4: KCSE D plain and above.

Q: How much are the school fees?

A: Programmes fee is 22,396 per Term, 67,189 Annually.

Q: Does Thika TTI offer hostels?

A: No.

Q: How do I apply?

A: Complete an application form, pay the application fee, and submit the required documents, either online or physically

Q: Is Thika TTI under KUCCPS?

A: Yes. Students may join through KUCCPS placement or direct application.

A: Yes. Eligible TVET students can apply for HELB loans and government scholarships.

A: Major intakes are usually in January, May, and September.

Section 2: CBET Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is CBET?

A: Competency-Based Education and Training focuses on practical skills, knowledge, and attitudes required in the workplace.

Q: How is CBET different from KNEC learning?

A: CBET emphasizes practical competence and continuous assessment rather than examination performance alone.

Q: What is a competency?

A: The ability to perform a task successfully according to industry standards.

Q: What are CBET levels?

A: Artisan- Level 4, Certificate- Level 5, and Diploma-Level 6, aligned with TVET qualification frameworks.

Q: Who developed CBET in Kenya?

A: It is implemented through the Ministry of Education, TVETA, and CDACC.

Q: What is CDACC?

A: The Curriculum Development Assessment and Certification Council responsible for curriculum development, assessment, and certification.

Q: How are students assessed in CBET?

A: Through practical demonstrations, projects, oral questions, written tests, and workplace tasks.

Q: What happens if a student is Not Yet Competent (NYC)?

A: The trainee is given an opportunity to improve and undergo reassessment.

Q: What does Competent mean?

A: The trainee has met the required industry standards.

Q: Is CBET more practical than theory?

A: Yes, CBET strongly emphasizes practical learning and workplace readiness.

Q: Does CBET include industrial attachment?

A: Yes, most CBET programs include industrial attachment.

Q: Are CBET certificates recognized?

A: Yes, certificates issued through accredited institutions and CDACC are recognized in Kenya.

Q: Can a student progress from level 4 to level 5?

A: Yes, progression is possible subject to meeting entry requirements.
